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

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
It may not be "natural" in a forest or welcome on a narrow city lot, but given the room, a tree reaches wide in parkland, a joy to see.

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I love the colours of the earth that come from within, whether the luminescence of a Gulf Coast ocean under a lowering sky, or the translucent rainbow shimmering in the body of an Amazon grasshopper. "*Between Sea and Sky: Manasota Key, Florida*", captures the essence of the Gulf of Mexico as it washes against the barrier islands of Florida's west coast, an environment that is being battered and transformed by climate change, with its intensified hurricanes and rising sea level. Manasota Key has been devastated twice by intense hurricanes since I took this picture in 2012.
